

Vicki Arn's Teeny Sweaters

These can be made into pins, or tree ornaments, or anything else a teeny sweater comes in handy for. Feel free to use up odds and ends of yarns by using them to make stripes or blocks of color in your teeny sweaters.

Size 0 and Size 2 single pointed needles

Front: With 0 needles, cast on 9 sts.

- Row 1: Rib
- Row 2: Change to Size 2 needles, Knit
- Row 3: Purl
- Row 4: Knit
- Row 5: Purl
- Row 6: Knit
- Row 7: Purl
- Row 8: Knit
- Row 9: Cast on 4 sts, purl to end (13 sts)
- Row 10: Cast on 4 sts, knit to end (17 sts)
- Row 11: Purl
- Row 12: K7, P3, K7
- Row 13: P7, bind off 3, P7
- Row 14: K7, cast on 3, K7
- Row 15: P7, K3, P7
- Row 16: Knit
- Row 17: Bind off 4 sts, P to end (13 sts)
- Row 18: Bind off 4 sts, K to end (9 sts)
- Row 19: Purl
- Row 20: Knit
- Row 21: Purl
- Row 22: Knit
- Row 23: Purl
- Row 24: Knit
- Row 25: Purl
- Row 26: Rib
- Row 27: Bind off
