Sales Tax Trends



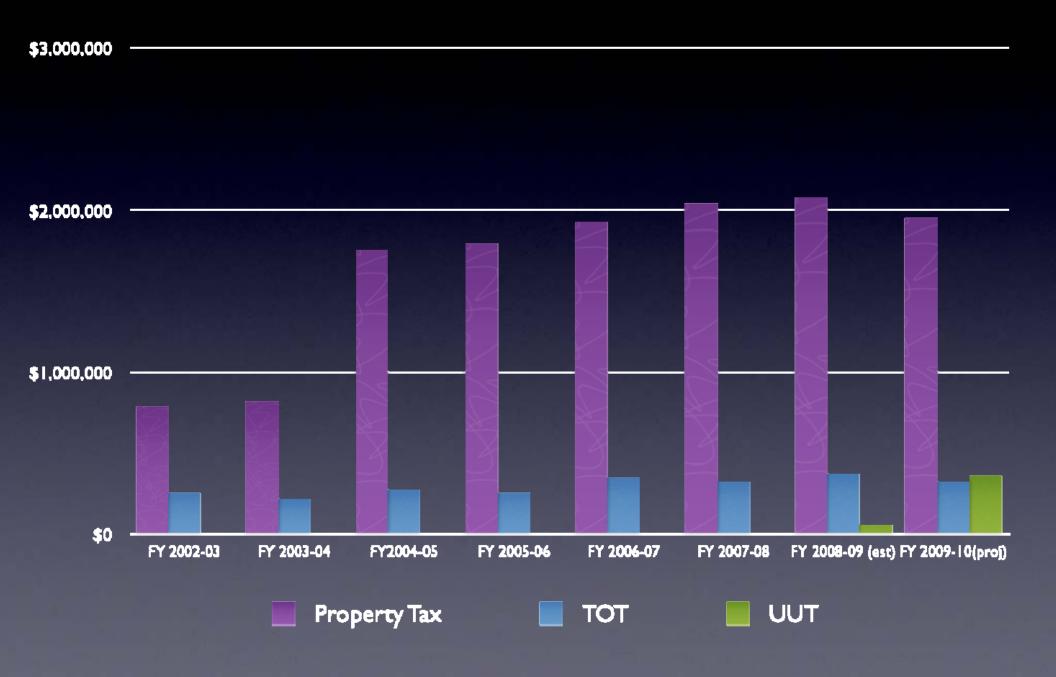


- Property Tastageowing \$158,000), \$2 billion statewide. Legislature did not move to allow municipalities to securitize this revenue.
- Redevelopment (\$797,000 in FY 09/10, \$140,000 in FY 10/11), \$2.05 billion statewide.
- State will withhold Gas Tax (HUTA) Funds until later in Fiscal Year

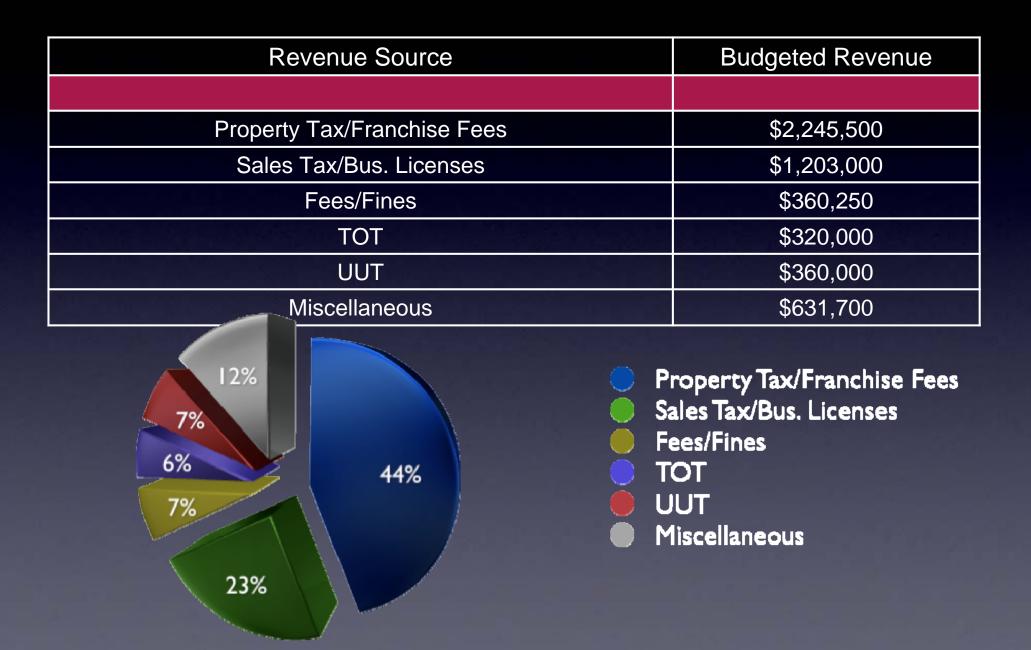

Historic Trends - Major Revenues

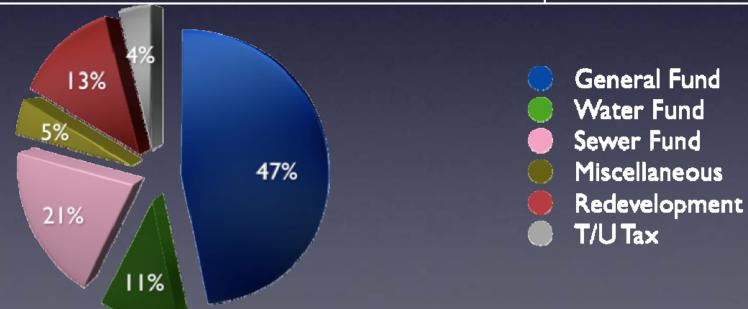


Projected FY 2009-10 General Fund Revenues

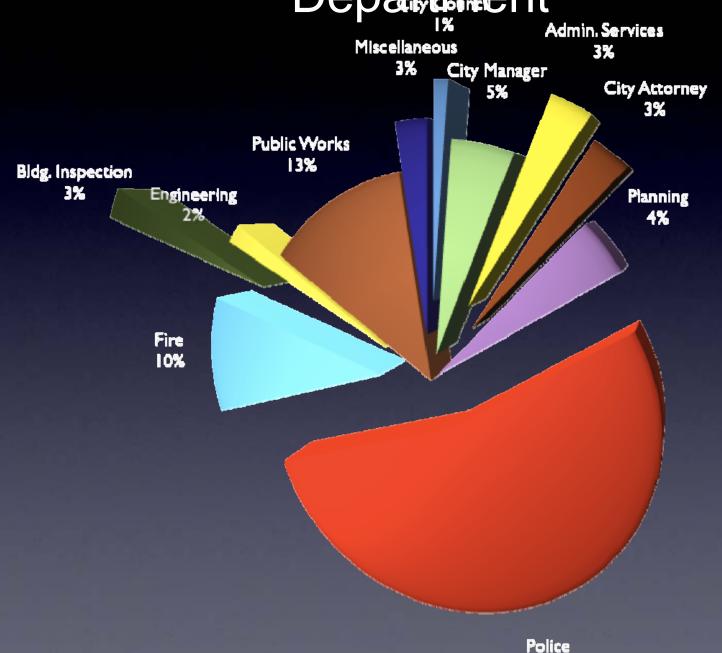

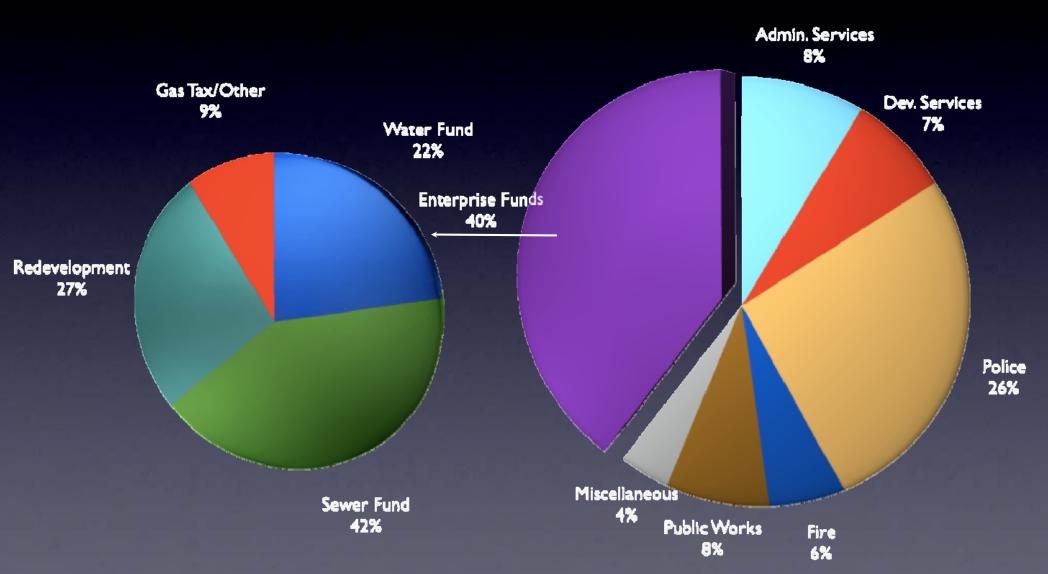


Expenditures - General Fund, By Department
