



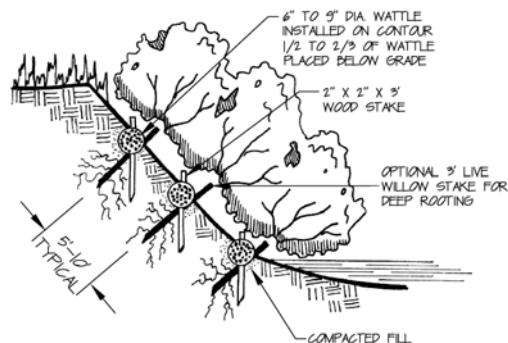

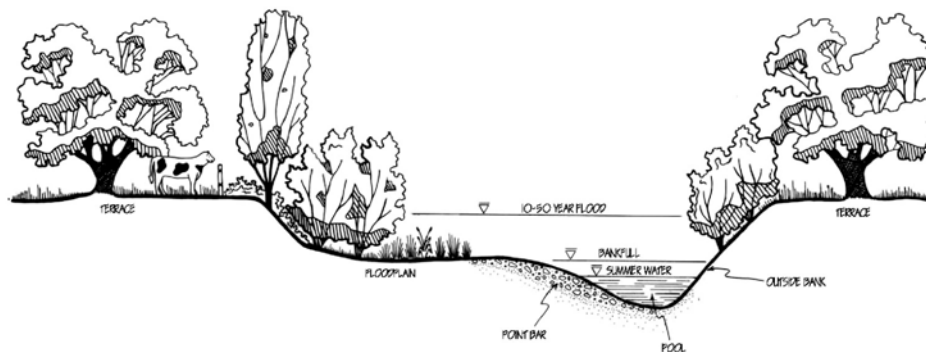
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Groundwork was originally published in 1987 as part of an erosion control grant to the Marin Resource Conservation District from the State Coastal Conservancy to address sedimentation and erosion in the Lagunitas Creek watershed. Written by Liza Prunuske, the first edition focused on gully and road repair, livestock-related erosion, and small landslides. It was intended to give practical, step-by-step help to rural landowners. Demand for the publication was very high with requests arriving from all over the U.S. and several foreign countries. Pieces of *Groundwork* have been used by the U.S. Forest Service in Wyoming, the Department of Fish and Game in their Habitat Restoration Manual, conservation corps, and many Resource Conservation Districts and watershed groups.

The second edition, published in June 2007, keeps the same intent of providing practical, useful help for the interested layperson. It has been expanded to include a simple explanation of erosion and stream-forming processes; specifications for many bioengineering techniques that can be built with no or minimal professional help; planting guidelines; revised recommendations for roads, new construction, and livestock management; and an updated resource section. *Groundwork* is available as a booklet and online.
